Right to Request Teacher Qualifications

As a parent of a student attending a school that is receiving Federal Title I dollars, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teacher(s) and instructional paraprofessional(s) who instruct your child. Federal law requires every Title I school district to comply and to provide you with the requested information in a timely manner.

We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA) includes additionally right-to-know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include:
- Subject matter tested, purpose of the test, source of the requirement (if applicable), amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and time and format of disseminating results.

Our staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in school and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable Pennsylvania state requirements.

We look forward to the upcoming school year, and together we will make a difference in your child's life.





Hello GMCS Families,

It was wonderful to meet so many of you at Back to School night. If we haven't yet met, please feel free to call, email, or come to see me. I will always welcome hearing from families so I know best how to care for your child.

As the new year begins, please be sure that any prescription medications that might be needed during the school day, have been delivered directly to the nurse along with the completed and signed forms. These medications might include emergency or "as needed" medications in case of allergy, asthma, anaphylaxis, or seizure. You will need new medication forms completed by the doctor each year, for each medication. If you need the forms, they are available on the school website or you may request copies from the nurse. Do not send medications on the bus (unless your doctor has signed approval for your student to carry emergency medication.

Please remember to keep contact information and over the counter medication consents update to date in FACTS.

WHEN SHOULD YOU STAY HOME?

SICK DAY OR SCHOOL DAY?

Wondering when you should keep your child home from school and when it's OK to send them? Help prevent the spread of germs by washing hands and surfaces, and keeping sick kids home from school.

FEVER

Any fever over 100.4 should be kept at home until 24 hours fever free without any medicine. You should not give your child fever-reducing medicine before school.

VOMITING & DIARRHEA

Vomiting and diarrhea should be kept home until at least 24 hours with no more symptoms.

PINKEYE

Pinkeye looks like a red eye, lots of goopy drainage, and intense itching. It is very easly transmittable. Pinkeye must be treated for at least 24 hours with precription medication from a doctor before returning to school.

COUGH &

Obvious, disruptive coughs and colds should be kept home until under control. Not only is the student unable to concentrate but they are preading germs to everyone else.

HEAD LICE

Any student with live active lice must stay home until treated and lice are no longer present. Proof of treatment should be brough to the nurse.

Students may come to school with nits but nits should be removed nightly until all clear.

GENERAL ILLNESS

You know your child best. If they are under the weather and you think they would benefit from staying home and not spreading germs or getting some rest then that is what you should do.

IT'S A SCHOOL DAY IF:

It's ok to go to school if you have things like allergies, rashes, bug bites, injuries, chronic illnesses (asthma, sickle cell, epilepsy), or if the doctor has cleared your child and says it's ok. If you're not sure then call your school nurse.



- 6. Sign a shirt Bring in a solid color t-shirt or a special birthday shirt that classmates can sign and wear for their birthday.












We have several events planned this year and need your help to make them successful. Please make sure you have all of your updated volunteer clearances in the front office.
